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2024: A Year in Review with the OFA

Growth, New Initiatives, and Exciting Announcements

As we reflect on 2024, the Governor's Office of Federal Assistance (OFA) is delighted to celebrate a year marked by substantial growth, new leadership, and innovative endeavors. In 2024, our organization underwent significant transformations as the introduction of new leadership brought fresh perspectives and a renewed direction. We embraced in-person training sessions, moving away from our previous virtual format, and made substantial investments in strengthening partnerships with our tribal and rural communities. These efforts have collectively contributed to our office's success and the positive impact we've made with and for the State of Nevada.

Nevada Newsroom: Introducing OFA's Blog

In 2024, the OFA launched our latest communications platform. Our blog, *The Nevada Newsroom*, is housed on our official LinkedIn account and state website. The Nevada Newsroom has been a valuable resource for sharing critical updates and insights. Blog posts thus far include a comprehensive summary of the changes to 2CFR, detailing the Office of Management and Budget's revisions to the Uniform Guidance. Additionally, we highlighted our collaborative training sessions with the Pyramid Lake Paiute Tribe (PLPT) and the Walker River Paiute Tribe (WRPT), which focused on enhancing their ability to identify and navigate federal assistance programs effectively.

An Informed State

The Nevada Governor's Office of Federal Assistance proudly hosted the Mandatory Statewide 2CFR training session on December 16, 2024. This all-day, in-person event provided essential guidance on navigating federal grant management and compliance. We are especially grateful for our expert speaker, Phillip Escoriaza from Feldesman Leifer LLP, and to Nevada GrantLab for sponsoring our lunch. Above all, the patience, participation, and support of the 500+ attendees truly made this event a resounding success.

In addition to our efforts to provide more training for the State, the State Plan for Maximizing Federal Assistance was developed in accordance with NRS223.486 and is accompanied by a 5-Year Strategic Plan. The State Plan is currently under review by the Nevada Advisory Council (NACFA), with stakeholder dissemination anticipated by late January. Transparency and collaboration are at the core of this effort. The State Plan represents a philosophical and strategic shift for Nevada, focusing on building the capacity of state agencies to apply for and manage federal grants effectively, enhancing inter-agency coordination, and leveraging public-private partnerships to increase competitiveness for discretionary grants.

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In adopting a more balanced approach—one that combines proactive planning with strategic responsiveness—we are ensuring that Nevada is positioned to maximize the impact of federal funding. The State Plan provides a clear roadmap to address challenges that aims to increase federal funding per capita, improve services for residents, and reduce the financial pressure on local budgets.

We are excited to continue building on the progress made this past year and are thrilled to share our efforts toward establishing a Nevada chapter of the National Grants Management Association (NGMA). This initiative aims to strengthen engagement among grant professionals across the state by creating opportunities for in-person networking and collaboration, all while building a supportive community. Through this chapter, we plan to host educational events to enhance skills, share best practices, and deepen understanding of federal funding processes in order to elevate Nevada's grant management capacity.

We are turning the page to create a more informed and prepared Nevada—one where federal funds are strategically leveraged to build a stronger, more resilient state.

Our digital footprint has grown significantly over the past year. Our website attracted a total of 44,453 views, with 14,000 new users and 2.7K returning visitors. We also welcomed 1,079 new email subscribers and saw an increase of over 409 followers on LinkedIn. Additionally, stay tuned for April 2025, where the OFA Director (A'Keia Sanders) will lead a panel discussion regarding funding with the Western Nevada Development District at their annual Member's Summit. In October 2025, the OFA will collaborate with the Nevada Department of Health and Human Services - Division of Public and Behavioral Health to bring information about grant writing and management to their annual Food Security Conference.
