Vision

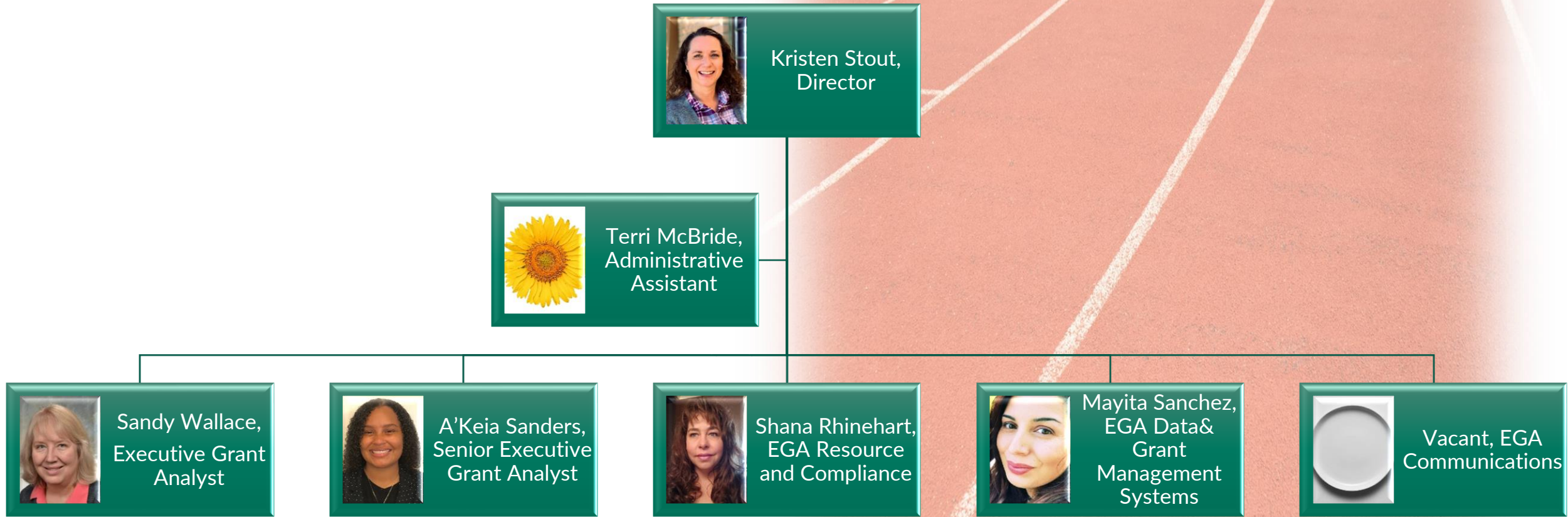
The Governor's Office of Federal Assistance supports our stakeholders in obtaining, increasing, and maximizing federal assistance.

Nevada Grant Matching Program

- Available for stakeholders for matching/cost sharing funding when applying for a *new* federal grant
- Applicants must:
 - Be a State Agency, local government, tribal government, or nonprofit organization
 - Attempt to secure match through their own budget or in-kind resources
 - Exhaust all potential match first
- Not to be used as an emergency match

Nevada Grant Matching Program Overview

- ❑ The Grant Matching Program's goal is to increase federal funding to the State of Nevada
- ❑ The program awards cash grants on a first-come, first-serve basis **to satisfy up to 50% of the required match** necessary to receive federal funding awards
- ❑ GMP is for required match only. It is not available for subawards or passed-through funds and is provided for the Recipient of the federal opportunity
- ❑ Applicants applying between March and June of any given year should contact grants@ofa.nv.gov to learn more about the upcoming deadlines due to the Nevada State Fiscal year and Biennial fiscal process



Nevada Grant Matching Program Overview

- ❑ Preference Is Given to Applicants for Federal Grants that Prioritize:
 - ❑ Adding services to constituents
 - ❑ Align with the documented priorities of the state agency, local agency, tribal government or nonprofit organization
 - ❑ Address the needs of underserved or frontier communities
 - ❑ Help state agencies, local agencies, tribal governments, and nonprofit organizations build capacity for future grant opportunities
 - ❑ Enable a state agency, local agency, tribal government, or nonprofit organization to sustain the grant within its next budget cycle.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Senate Bill 431 Has Increased Work Program Thresholds

Went into effect July 1, 2023

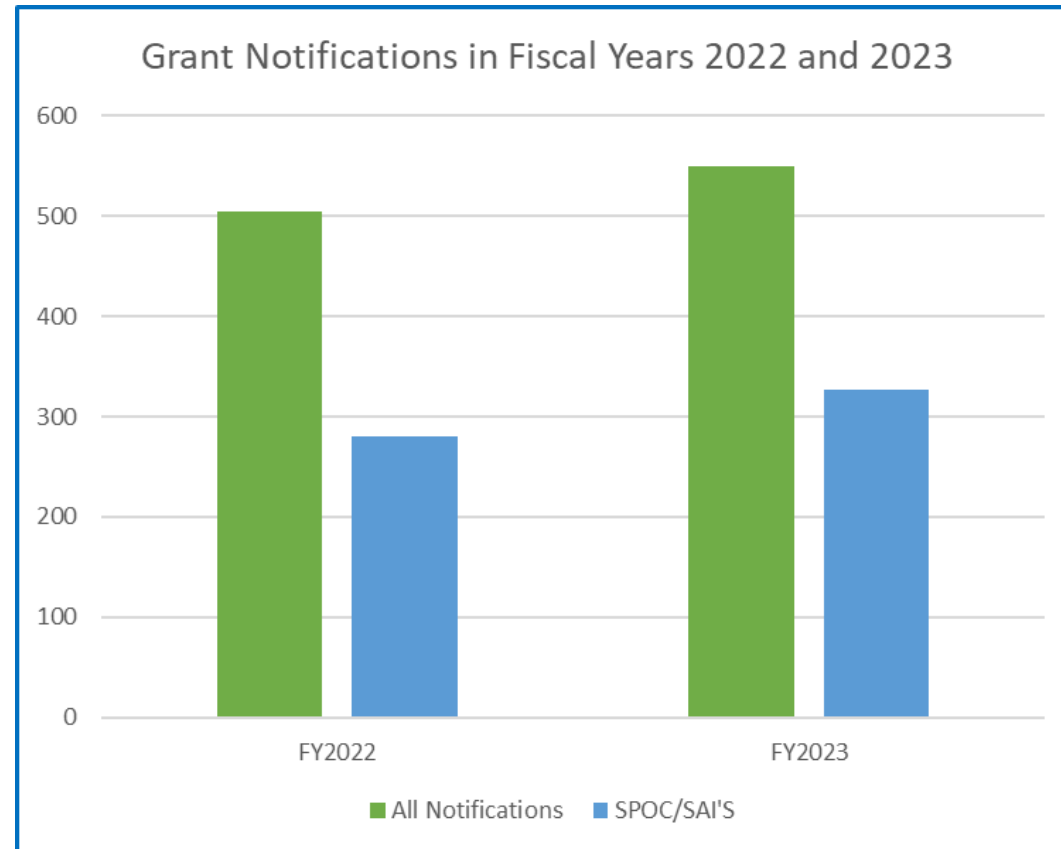
Work Program (WP) Thresholds Increase for Interim Finance Committee (IFC)

Changes Include:

- Revision of WPs over \$75,000 will need IFC consideration, past threshold is over \$30,000
- Revisions of FY WPs (done annually) that increase or decrease allotments by 20% or \$350,000, whichever is less, past threshold is 10% or \$75,000, whichever is less
- Receipt of gifts or grants (governmental or non-governmental) under \$200,000 are *not* subject to IFC review, past thresholds are under \$20,000 for gift or non-governmental and below \$150,000 for governmental grants

SINGLE POINT OF CONTACT, INTERGOVERNMENTAL REVIEW

- FEDERAL EXECUTIVE ORDER (E.O) 12372
- Also referred to as the Intergovernmental Review
- Purpose is to coordinate in-state grant applications
- & fosters intergovernmental partnerships
- The Grant Application and Submission information (SF-424) will inform the applicant that an Intergovernmental Review is Required, and the SPOC must be notified to comply with the State's process under EO 12372

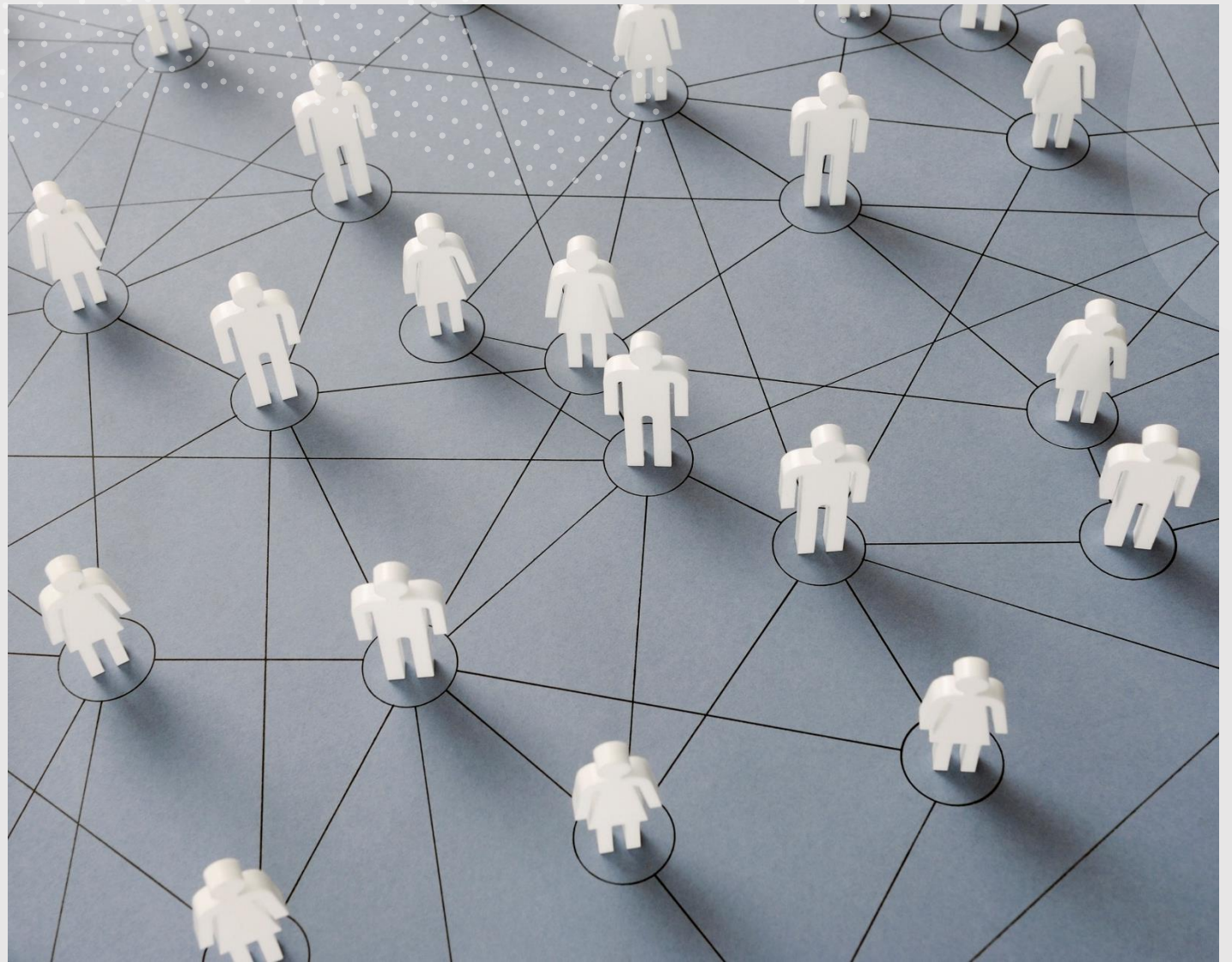


STATE AGENCY NOTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS TO OFA

- Nevada Revised Statute (NRS) 223.480
- State Administrative Manual (SAM) 3000
- Required reporting to the Office of Federal Assistance done through the online Federal Assistance Notification Form
- STATE AGENCIES ARE REQUIRED TO SUBMIT THEIR NOTICE OF APPLICATION, ANY CHANGES TO AN EXISTING GRANT AWARD, AS WELL AS NOTIFICATION OF CLOSE OUT AND IF FUNDS WILL OR HAVE BEEN UNEXPENDED AT THE END OF GRANT PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

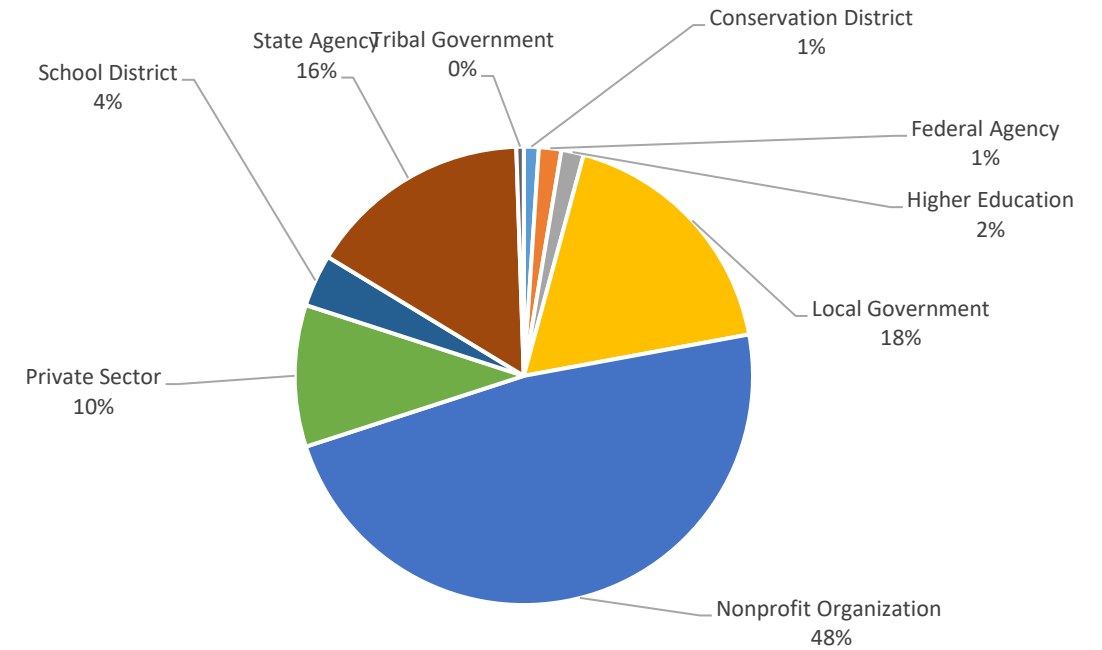

HOW TO LEVERAGE

Eligibility Codes

- Mirrors what is within grants.gov
- Filters the grant opportunities you will see
- Saved, only needs to be set up once
- Can be Edited

Keywords

- Grants Tab will filter by your preset keywords that you have set
- The more keywords you have, you may see more, *or less* opportunities
- If *no* keywords are set, you will see *all grants*

Grants Tab

- Shows grants because of your filters
- Syncs with grants.gov daily

Grant Detail

- Pulled directly from grants.gov
- Provides a direct link to the notice of funding opportunity on grants.gov

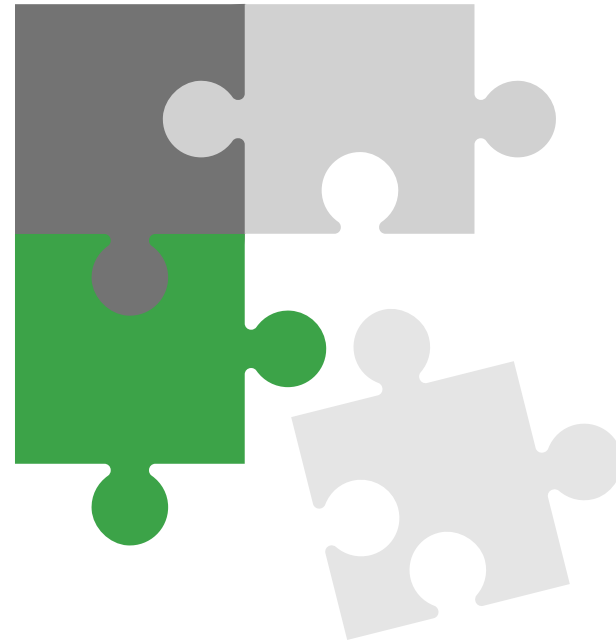

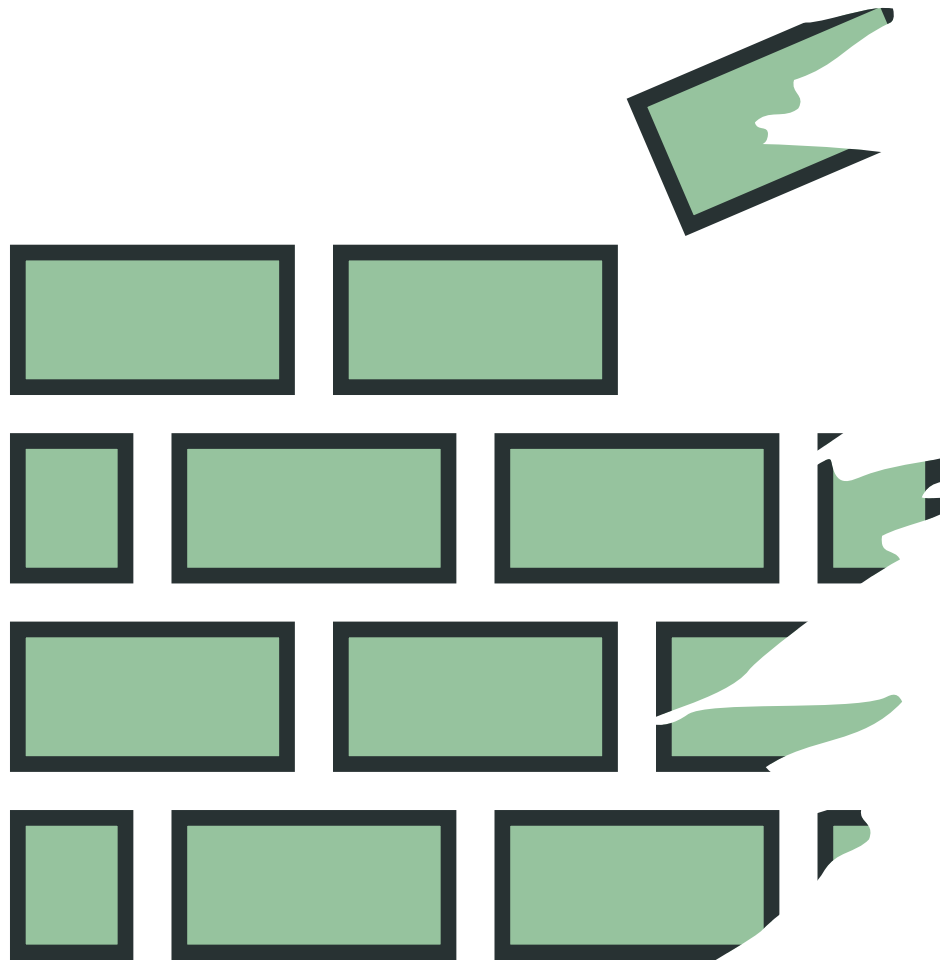
- Does it fit the current priorities, needs, mission, vision, goals?
