These species degrade habitats vital for wildlife, water systems, recreation, and rural economies. Human activity and natural disturbances like wildfires have accelerated their spread. Noxious weeds are particularly aggressive and legally recognized as harmful. Their presence negatively impacts agriculture, recreation, and the health of both public and private lands.

The BLM focuses on conserving key wildlife habitats and reducing threats to species by monitoring populations, assessing habitat conditions, and using data to guide management actions. Efforts include evaluating progress toward conservation goals, enhancing public education and stewardship, and increasing awareness of wildlife resources and conservation successes on BLM-managed lands.
