Description:	The Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department (LVMPD) Organizational Development Bureau is requesting grant funds from the FY24 Safer Outcomes: Enhancing De-Escalation and Crisis Response Training for Law Enforcement – Support for Law Enforcement Agencies grant for the LVMPD Incident Command Post Training project to expand and enhance the training law enforcement supervisors receive to manage incident command posts in conjunction with de-escalation practices. All LVMPD law enforcement officers and supervisors are required to participate in reality-based training where they learn and utilize de-escalation skills when involved in volatile police encounters; however, supervisors are not educated on using the same de-escalation techniques when managing incident command posts for larger scale events. Seventy-eight authorized enforcement police lieutenant and 346 authorized enforcement police sergeant positions ¹ partake in the current reality-based training program. As low- and mid-level supervisors, the employees oversee 3,025 authorized enforcement police officer positions. This method is especially important when encountering a citizen or suspect who is disabled, experiencing a mental health or behavioral crisis, suffering from suicidal ideations, or other issues requiring the help of a Crisis Intervention Team. By interacting or deploying additional calming methods during a highly charged law enforcement event will reduce the strength of a potentially aggressive circumstance and will allow the supervisor to manage the officers and scene without physical force, or decreased force.
