	scale events. Seventy-eight authorized enforcement police
	lieutenant and 346 authorized enforcement police sergeant
	positions1 partake in the current reality-based training program.
	As low- and mid-level supervisors, the employees oversee 3,025
	authorized enforcement police officer positions. This method is
	especially important when encountering a citizen or suspect who
	is disabled, experiencing a mental health or behavioral crisis,
	suffering from suicidal ideations, or other issues requiring the
	help of a Crisis Intervention Team. By interacting or deploying
	additional calming methods during a highly charged law
	enforcement event will reduce the strength of a potentially
	aggressive circumstance and will allow the supervisor to manage
	the officers and scene without physical force, or decreased force.
